

PCYC ANNUAL REGATTA SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Saturday, July 1, 2023

Pointe-Claire Yacht Club Lac St. Louis, Quebec

1. RULES

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing. (RRS)

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at <u>2023 Official Notice Board I</u> <u>PCYC</u> before 9:00am on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 8:00pm on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted at 2023 Official Notice Board | PCYC

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4. CODE OF CONDUCT

4.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag mast of the Race Committee boat docked at PCYC and a Notice to Competitors on the <u>PCYC Official Notice Board</u> will indicate the flag(s) displayed.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

6. CLASS FLAGS

6.1. The class flags are:

IVISION	FLAG
1	Purple
2	Green
3	White
4	Yellow

7. COURSES

- 7.1 The courses are identified in Addendum A.
- 7.2 For Divisions 1 and 2, the course to be sailed will be windward/leeward either 2 times around the Regular Course, or one time around the Short Course. All course marks must be left to port.
- 7.3 The requirement to sail a Short Course will be signaled by the Race Committee signal vessel by displaying numeral pennant 1 with the class flag. If numeral pennant 1 is not displayed, boats shallsail the Regular Course.
- 7.4 The windward mark for Division 1 will be located to windward approximately 1 nautical mile from the leeward mark. The location of the mark shall not be grounds for protest.
- 7.5 The windward mark for Division 2 will be located to windward approximately 0.7 nautical miles from the leeward mark. The location of the mark shall not be grounds for protest.
- 7.6 For Division 3 the course to be sailed will be a triangle either 2 times around or one time around the course. The windward mark will be located to windward approximately 0.7 nautical miles from the leeward mark. The location of the mark shall not be grounds for protest. All course marks must be left toport.
- 7.7 For Division 4 the Regular Course to be sailed will be a triangle followed by a windward/leeward. The Short Course will be a windward/leeward course. The windward mark will be located to windward approximately 0,7 nautical miles from the leeward mark. The location of the mark shall not be grounds for protest. All course marks must be left to port.
- 7.8 Courses will not be shortened. This changes RRS 32.
- 7.9 Legs of the course will not be changed after the preparatory signal. This changes RRS 33.

8. MARKS

- 8.1 The marks that may be used are yellow and orange inflatable marks
- 8.2 The starting/finishing mark is a red ball.

9. THE START

- 9.1 Races will be started using RRS 26.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel and the course side of the starting/finishing mark.
- 9.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- 9.4 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress for request. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 9.5 A boat that does not start within four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 9.6 The order of starts will be determined by the flags flown by the race committee. The race committee will attempt to start the divisions in sequential order. To facilitate race management, the race committee may change the order of starts or start multiple divisions together, at its discretion. Such action by the race committee will not be grounds for redress.

10. THE FINISH

10.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the signal vessel and the course side of the starting/finishing mark.

11. TIME LIMITS


- 11.1 The Finishing Window, which is the time limit for boats to finish after the first boat of their division sails the course and finishes, will be 30 minutes.
- 11.2 Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window shall be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. Thischanges RRS 35, A4 and A5.

12. HEARING REQUESTS

- 12.1 The protest time limit is 8:00pm the day of the regatta.
- 12.2 Hearing request forms can be found at www.gnsracing.com under the section "IMPORTANT LINKS".
- 12.3 Notices will be posted no later than 48 hours after a race to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 12.4 Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at Pointe-Claire Yacht Club.
- 12.5 RRS 62.2(a) and 66.2(a) do not apply.
