

PCYC ANNUAL REGATTA SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Saturday, June 28, 2025

Pointe-Claire Yacht Club Lac St. Louis, Quebec

1. RULES

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at <u>Official Notice</u> <u>Board | PCYC</u> before 9:00am on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 8:00pm on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be sent by email and to the address entered in the boat registration form.
- 3.2 On the water, VHF channel 78 is restricted to Race Committee communication. Competitors may use channel 78 during races for urgent or safety messages only. Misuse of channel 78 during the races could be considered as misconduct RRS 69.

4. CODE OF CONDUCT


4.1 [DP] Competitors and support personnel shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag mast of the Race Committee boat docked at PCYC and an email notification will be sent simultaneously to the entire GNS registered fleet.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

6. CLASS FLAGS

6.1 The class flags are:



7. COURSES

7.1 The courses are defined in Addendum A.

8. MARKS

- 8.1 The marks that may be used are yellow and orange inflatable marks.
- 8.2 The starting/finishing mark is a red ball.

9. THE START

- 9.1 Races will be started using RRS 26.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel and thecourse side of the starting mark.
- 9.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other divisions.
- 9.4 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure ofher to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress for request. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 9.5 A boat that does not start within 4 (four) minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS (Did Not Start) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 9.6 The order of starts will be determined by the flags flown by the race committee. The race committee will attempt to start the divisions in sequential order. To facilitate race management, the race committee may change the order of starts or start multiple divisions together, at its discretion. Such action by the race committee will not be grounds for redress.

10. THE FINISH

10.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the signal vessel and the course sideof the finishing mark.

11. TIME LIMITS

- 11.1 The Finishing Window, which is the time limit for boats to finish after the first boat of their division sails the course and finishes, will be 30 minutes.
- 11.2 Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window shall be scored DNF (Did Not Finish) without a hearing. Thischanges RRS 35, A4 and A5.

12. HEARING REQUESTS

- 12.1 The protest time limit is 8:00pm the day of the regatta.
- 12.2 Hearing request forms can be found on the Official Notice Board at www.gnsracing.com.
- 12.3 Notices will be posted no later than 48 hours after a race to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 12.4 Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at the Pointe-Claire Yacht Club.
- 12.5 RRS 62.2(a) and 66.2(a) do not apply.
